



# How One School District Saved 25% in Hard Cost using CMMS

Dianna Drew, Director of Logistics & Documents Services, Grand Prairie Independent School System

Selecting a computerized maintenance management software (CMMS) system became a priority for Grand Prairie Independent School District (GPISD). GPISD employs 4,198 people and serves 29,000 students on 38 campuses. With more than 40 buildings, a high number of maintenance and repair tasks were requested including: irrigation, plumbing, refrigeration, heating and ventilation, grounds issues, locks and keys, and moving requests. After adding the eMaint

CMMS, GPISD saved time, decreased work requests from 700 per year to 584, and reduced inventory items from 10,000 inventory line items (with multiple SKUs for the same part) to 2,987 items.


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

# Hurricane Irma and the US Embassy in Havana - Dealing with a Natural Disaster Overseas

The 2017 hurricane season lasted from June 1 to November 30, causing over 3,300 deaths and 280 billion dollars in damages. Almost all of these damages (99.7%) were caused by just three hurricanes: Irma, Harvey and Maria. Category 5 hurricane Irma plowed through Havana, Cuba for three days, wreaking havoc and destruction across the island, to include at the US Embassy. This is how the US State Department, Bureau of Overseas Building Operations and the Facility Management team on site responded to quickly clean up and restore operations to the Embassy compound and ensure the safety of its diplomats before, during, and after Hurricane Irma.

# Municipal Mobile Maintenance Program: Success with the City of Baltimore

The Mobile Maintenance Program (MMP) is a data driven initiative born of a 2016 statistical and process analysis on performance of the City's Facility Maintenance Outcome Budget KPIs. MMP allowed the Maintenance Division to protect public dollars, significantly reduce work order durations, and increased technician morale. Prior to the implementation of MMP it took 18 days longer to address and close critical work orders if they originated in a facility outside of the core downtown campus. This talk covers the project life cycle, lessons learned, outcomes and reusable components and project infrastructure for organizations interested in a similar implementation.




